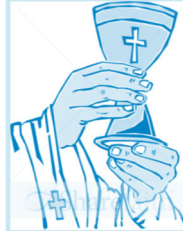

Dear Parishioners,

Next weekend, we will celebrate the Solemnity of the Ascension of our Lord. It calls us to reflect upon the mystery of our Lord entering heaven not only with His divine nature, but also with His glorified human nature. The time of His earthly mission having been completed, our Lord ascends into heaven, from where He continues to build up, nourish and guide His faithful. While we often naturally look up into the skies when we think of heaven, much like those Apostles did as the Lord was lifted up, we recognize that it is something more than a place of higher altitude. Heaven is the realm of those angels and souls who enjoy the presence of God in such a profound way that they come to rest in a joy that can only come from union with the ultimate Good. No suffering can touch one there, and their rest never becomes tedious. The degree to which they enjoy the Lord's Presence is the degree to which they loved as they left this earthly life, and so not all will enjoy it in the same way. Although all will be fulfilled, those who loved God above all things and their neighbor love of Him with greater intensity and attention will have a greater capacity within their hearts to embrace God in the next life.

Of course, there is no heart like that of the Sacred Heart that has given itself so completely out of love of the Father or matched His desire for the salvation of souls. Sometimes called the "tabernacle of Infinite Love," the Sacred Heart places before us a motive for our own growth in charity. It is the source of our capacity to love God and neighbor not merely on a natural level, but also on a supernatural level with the assistance of grace and the Holy Spirit. It is a model for the way in which we are called to love, for having been pierced to cleanse us of sin and beating always in rhythm with the Love of the Father, the Sacred Heart shows us the extent to which we are called to love. It also reveals to us our goal, for now having ascended to the right hand of the Father, the Sacred Heart that now beats in heaven shows to us the fulfillment of our hope as we continue to journey in this life.

The words from the Gospel of Matthew reveal to us the desires of the Sacred Heart that others may

come to share in salvation, as He tells His Apostles: "...make disciples of all nations, baptizing them... teaching them to observe all I have commanded you." They are to continue His mission through the sacraments and preaching the Gospel, guiding whatever souls divine Providence gives to them. As the Archdiocese receives seven more priests to participate in this mission of our Lord, we particularly celebrate the ordination of now Father Mark Madden here at IHM. May God bless him and all our newly ordained as they begin their ministry for the Church as priests called to be shepherds according to the Heart of Christ.
