I though you should know - May 23, 2021

We have many exciting events coming to Immaculate Heart of Mary Parish in the days ahead! In first place, Reverend Mr. Jack Ruzicka, who grew up in our parish and went to our school, will be ordained a priest for the Archdiocese of St. Louis this Saturday on May 29, 2021 and will celebrate his First Mass at 2:00 pm on Sunday May 30, 2021 here at Immaculate Heart of Mary Parish. All are welcome to attend his First Mass, and there will be simple reception afterwards in the Father Keaney Center. Congratulations to his parents, John and Jeanne Ruzicka—thank you for accepting Jack with love into your family and for raising him into the faith! Let's all pray for Reverend Mr. Jack Ruzicka, his family, and his first priestly assignment this week!

Second, the candidates for our Worship Leader position will have auditions here at Immaculate Heart of Mary Parish on Tuesday June 1, 2021 from 7 pm to 9 pm. I want to invite everyone to come and listen to the candidates. Your input can help me understand candidate would most help us make and grow disciples here at Immaculate Heart of Mary Parish. No need to register or sign up if you want to come—just be here in Church at 7 pm on Tuesday June 1, 2021. Most of all, please pray that we make a wise decision on who to hire!

Third, we have our parish feast day celebration on June 12-13. We'll spend that weekend honoring Mary our Mother under the title of her Immaculate Heart. It's a great weekend to invite your friends and family to join us for Mass. I hope that you are considering dedicating your family to the Sacred Heart of Jesus and Immaculate Heart of Mary on that day.

Finally, we have three events coming up to help us prepare for the celebration of our feast day. Next weekend, May 29-30, I'll take time after all each Mass to answer questions about our Catholic faith. You'll be able to ask your questions anonymously, if you like, and you can ask about anything—theology, history, personal spiritual questions, what we do at Mass, or about what it means to consecrate your family and home to God. On the following weekend, June 5-6, we'll have confessions before and after all our weekend masses. Lastly, right before our parish feast day celebration, on the morning of June 12, Saturday, at 8 am, we'll have a special Mass with extra spiritual warfare prayers asking for God's defense and protection of our families.

The first installment of our "Dedicated" homily series is below; "Dedicated" will run through June 12-13. God bless you!

In grade school, I usually cared more about food and fun than "God's will be done", but I still noticed something special about by best friend's family. Every dinner they prayed two prayers we didn't say in my family. In the first, they dedicated their to Jesus' Sacred Heart. In the second, they said, "O Sweet and gentle Lady, Immaculate Mother of God, we choose you this day to be the Mistress and Lady of this house." Young as I was—and not particularly spiritual—I still had a sense of spiritual power as they prayed those two prayers united together. I felt the power of their dedication.

The reverse Spiderman principle connects power and dedication. "With great power comes great responsibility", Uncle Ben tells Peter Parker, and Uncle Ben is right. But the reverse is also true: great responsibility comes great power. As we dedicate ourselves to God's good purpose, he increases our share in his power. For "God is the one who, for his good purpose, works in you" (Philippians 2:13)

You see, the Lord God is a big respecter of human freedom: because "first he invented it, and then he perfected it, and then he made [it] ... invincible on the field of battle" ("Meet the Soldier", Valve Corporation). God invented human freedom, creating it because he loves us and how freedom lets us love like him, as his children and his family. Then, in Jesus Christ, God perfected human freedom, and he seeks to bring each disciple to be like the teacher, with a human freedom strong and clear, pointed up towards excellence and able to choose great things. And, God wants to make our human freedom "invincible on the field of battle", triumphant over our spiritual enemies. But necessarily, our Lord's desire that freedom should triumph means respecting that it exists.

So the Lord always helps us, sometimes nudging us from outside, sometimes stirring our hearts inside. And we call these sorts of help actual graces, because they act on us. But the Lord's greatest help comes when we freely

choose to let him come in deep, when we rest in him and let him rest in us, when we let him change us and share his own life with us. We call this greater help sanctifying grace, because it makes us holy. This is a why with great responsibility comes great power. As we take responsibility for our part in God's purposes, as we dedicate ourselves to the Lord, we give him permission to act in our lives, and his power in us increases.

So we can see at least two great reasons to dedicate ourselves to the Lord. The first reason is that the God's purpose is so good. His purpose is to make us the light of the world, so that people who see us can believe that Jesus came from the Father, and that as the Father loves Jesus, so he also loves us. At the end of the bible, Jesus says, "Behold, I make all things new." (Revelation 21:5) That's the Lord's purpose, to restore the beauty of his creation, and as part of that work, to bring our friends and family through Jesus Christ, to the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. "May the God of our Lord Jesus Christ [open] the eyes of your hearts ... that you may know what is the hope that belongs to his call, what are the riches of glory in his inheritance among the holy ones, and what is the surpassing greatness of his power for us who believe." (Ephesians 1: 17-19)

The second reason to dedicate ourselves to God is that when we dedicate ourselves the Lord's purpose, we gain power against our spiritual enemies. I think my most decisive spiritual enemy is myself. I get myself in more messes than anyone else gets me into. But when I remember that God has purpose for me and that I have committed myself to that purpose, when I remember that Jesus really does love me and that I'll see it all someday, how it's worth it to love Jesus, in a word, when I am dedicated to Jesus, then my heart is less divided. Proverbs 29:18 says, "Without a vision, the people lose restraint." Dedication to the Lord gives my life vision, makes me wise and more disciplines, so I am more of a friend to myself, and less of an enemy.

Dedication to the Lord also gives us power against our external spiritual enemies. St. Ignatius called the devil the "enemy of human nature". We don't talk about the devil much in church, because he's way less important than Jesus, but evil spirits do exist, and they work for our ruin by tempting us to sin, by selling us lies, and by trying to make our worse instincts and our worse moments worse and worse. As Christians, we don't have to fear the evil spirits, we don't have to fear them if we are close to Jesus, because Jesus defeated all of our spiritual enemies at the Cross with his power as God. Since dedication to the Lord unites us more closely to the Lord, it increase our power against the enemies of our human nature.

Risen from the dead, Jesus promised, "You will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you, and you will be my witnesses". After Jesus ascended into heaven, his first disciples dedicated themselves to his purpose, and Jesus kept his promise. "They went forth and preached everywhere, while the Lord worked with them and confirmed the word through accompanying signs." (Mark 16:20) I want to see that in my life, and I bet you do to.

So over the next four weeks, I'm going to share with you a way to dedicate your life the Lord by consecrating your home and your family to the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Immaculate Heart of Mary. Then, on the weekend of June 12 and June 13, while we celebrate our parish feast day, the Immaculate Heart of Mary, we'll invite you, if you want, to consecrate, to dedicate, your family and your home, big or small, to the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Immaculate Heart of Mary. We'll be learning lots more about this in the weeks ahead, so I'll conclude simply by showing you something.

This is my image of the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Immaculate Heart of Mary that I enthroned in my home years ago when I dedicated my little home—a few rooms in a dorm or rectory—to the Sacred and Immaculate Hearts. I took this image with me to Rome, and brought it back when I came home. When I moved in here in August, it went up in my bedroom. Each morning, I kneel down by my bed under this image and dedicate myself to Jesus and Mary. They have been very good to me, protecting me and giving me a spiritual power that I just don't have on my own. So in the week ahead, I invite you to take some action for God's purpose, relying on his power, and to begin considering dedicating your family to the Sacred and Immaculate Hearts.
