## I thought you should know - May 16, 2021

I am excited to announce that we start a new homily series today, and a homily series preparing for something big. "Dedicated" is a homily series about dedicating ourselves, our homes, and our families to the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Immaculate Heart of Mary. When we dedicate our ourselves to Jesus, we say "Yes" to his desire to make us part of his plan and saving work. In the weeks ahead, we'll learn about how dedicating our ourselves to Jesus defends us against our spiritual enemies, gives us power to bear witness to God, and opens us a greater gift of the Holy Spirit. We'll introduce a good way to dedicate ourselves to Jesus: consecrating our families to the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Immaculate Heart of Mary, and enthroning-that means putting somewhere specialin our homes an image of Jesus and Mary. As we dedicate ourselves to God, we live out in the humble life of our homes God's great purposes.

All this prepares for the feast of the Immaculate Heart of Mary, our parish feast day, on June 12. On that day, we hope many people in our parish dedicate their homes to the Sacred and Immaculate Hearts. We'll invite everyone to do that at Mass on the weekend June 12-13, and we'll also have a big celebration, with treats after all the Sunday Masses! :) This weekend will be a great weekend to invite your family to join you for Sunday Mass here at IHM.

As part of our preparation for the feast day and consecration of our homes, we'll have not only this "Dedicated" homily series, but also other special events, too. After all the Masses on May 29-30 we'll have time for questions and answers with me after Masses. I love good questions, so bring your questions about consecrating your home to Jesus and Mary, or any faith topic that interests you. Before and after Masses on June 5-6 we'll have confessions available with me and also some visiting priests.

Please pray for the success of our parish feast day celebration, including good weather! Most of all, please pray for spiritual success of our feast day, that is, many people giving their hearts and homes to Jesus and Mary on that day.

The last installment of our "Share What You Have" homily series is below. God bless you!

For me, Mother's Day is important to help me remember. It's hard even to hold in my mind all that my mom taught us, her years of care for us, and her countless gifts of affection and service. And I'm going to make mom take some of the blame that, because it seems like every time I see mom I carry away with me another example of how she really does love us by sharing with us her time and attention and home and cooking and prayer and insights, by sharing her life with us. It really hard to remember all her earlier gifts when she keeps put fresh beautiful new one on the top of the pile! All joking aside, I want to tell my mom this weekend thank you for your good example and please don't stop. It really helps me.

That's why I think this Mother's Day weekend is the perfect weekend to conclude our "Share What You Have" homily series. The big idea for this series was that what unites us deeply gives us a foundation for deep sharing. When a woman becomes a mother by childbirth, or by adoption, or by spiritual motherhood-I mean, by a deep, lasting, steady commitment to someone else's growth and good-that moment of becoming a mother makes a deep bond uniting mother and child. St. Angela Merici said, "Mothers of children, even if they have a thousand, carry each and every one fixed in their hearts and because of the strength of their love they do not forget any of them." We have such good reason to praise each woman who builds on that deep bond a life of deep sharing.

Sisters and brothers, today we heard Jesus say, "This is my commandment", that is, the one that is uniquely his. He goes on, "Love one another", that is, help one another and share with one another, and offer costly goods to each other, "as I have loved you". "As I have loved you": this is the part of the commandment which the commandment uniquely his. Then he reminds us what his love for us was like: "No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends."

Why did the Son of God become a little one cell human in the womb of Mary? Why did the same Son of God, grown up as Jesus of Nazareth, the son of Mary, teach us and call us his friends? Why did he lay down his life for
us? He told us why today. As you listen to his words again, notice how they connect sharing and unity: "so that my joy may be in you, and your joy may be complete."
For the good news is that as a good mother loves her child, so also the Triune God, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, loves you. As a good mother shares deeply with her children because of her deep unity with her children, so Jesus shares deeply with us, because he is united to us in his humanity and his passion and his resurrection. If your relationship with your mom is hard, there is so much hope for you and your mom, because Jesus is committed to your good with a love that steady and generous and faithful. Maybe you've never known a love like that, or maybe it's hard to feel it right now, but God says, "Can a mother forget her infant, be without tenderness for the child of her womb? Even if she should forget, I will never forget you".

Or, if you have a good mom who loves you, you have one of the biggest gifts in the world, and one of the biggest helps to understand how Jesus loves us. Or, if your mom has left this life for eternal life, this moment is one of the good parts of Mother's day. For Jesus truly present in the Eucharist is united to you and united to your mom, and though we can't see it with our eyes, you and your mom are one right now, united through Jesus in praise of the Father together in the unity of the Holy Spirit.

I thought about a lot of different invitations I could extend to you for this week, things you could carry away with from this homily for the week ahead. I thought about inviting you, if your mom is a good mom, to be like your mom and like Jesus and look for times this week when you can lay down your life for a friend. Or, I thought about inviting you, if your relationship with your mom was hard, to pray for your mom today, because in Jesus' deep unity with us, he can heal even our deepest wounds and deepest regrets. Or, I thought about just inviting you right now, to take in and let out deep breath, and to remember that you mom is with you right now, and she is glad you are here.

But though I thought about giving you those invitations, I'm going take this in a different direction and to give you a different invitation instead, because there is an order of operations here that is important, and a foundation we need to clear of rubble if we are going to build something beautiful that lasts. So I want to invite you to ask yourself something that I'm thinking about for myself. Is there some pattern in my life, something I keep doing, or something I keep neglecting, that's pushing Jesus and his love away from me by sin, a pattern of sing that making me weaker in sharing with other? And if you see something in your life like that, I want to encourage you to go to Jesus with so much hope and trust, and ask him, "Lord, help me with this. Please give me wisdom. Show me what to do; give me wisdom on how to change; help me, Lord. I need you." For the order of operations is that first Jesus loves $u s_{s}$ then we remain in him, and then we can share deeply, and the foundation for building something beautiful is what Jesus said in the Gospel today. "As the Father has loved me, so I have loved you. Remain in my love."

For we all need a love that unites us, and in Jesus Christ, we all have it.

# Saint of the Week 

## Saint Paschal Baylon

Saint of the Day for May 17

## Saint Paschal Baylon's story

In Paschal's lifetime the Spanish empire in the New World was at the height of its power, though France and England were soon to reduce its influence. The 16th century has been called the Golden Age of the Church in Spain, for it gave birth to Ignatius of Loyola, Francis Xavier, Teresa of Avila, John of the Cross, Peter of Alcantara, Francis Solano, and Salvator of Horta.

Paschal's Spanish parents were poor and pious. Between the ages of seven and 24 he worked as a shepherd and began a life of mortification. He was able to pray on the job and was especially attentive to the church bell, which rang at the Elevation during Mass. Paschal had a very honest streak in him. He once offered to pay owners of crops for any damage his animals caused!

In 1564, Paschal joined the Friars Minor and gave himself wholeheartedly to a life of penance. Though he was urged to study for the priesthood, he chose to be a brother. At various times he served as porter, cook, gardener, and official beggar.

Paschal was careful to observe the vow of poverty. He would never waste any food or anything given for the use of the friars. When he was porter and took care of the poor coming to the door, he developed a reputation for great generosity. The friars sometimes tried to moderate his liberality!
Paschal spent his spare moments praying before the Blessed Sacrament. In time, many people sought his wise counsel. People flocked to his tomb immediately after his burial; miracles were reported promptly. Paschal was canonized in 1690 and was named patron
of eucharistic congresses and societies in 1897.

## Reflection

Prayer before the Blessed Sacrament occupied much of Saint Francis' energy. Most of his letters were to promote devotion to the Eucharist. Paschal shared that concern. An hour in prayer before our Lord in the Eucharist could teach all of us a great deal. Some holy and busy Catholics today find that their work is enriched by those minutes regularly spent in prayer and meditation.

Let's Talk about Faith
It can be intimidating to bring up your faith to family or friends. Those little voices tell us "I don't know enough about the Bible or doctrine to speak to others, I might be rejected, I do not know how to express myself, I don't want people to make fun of me or call me a 'Holy Roller.' Let's really think about those statements. Do you think that's The Holy Spirit talking to you or is that coming from negativity from your past, thoughts that keep you from sharing what you have experienced with Jesus. Someone in your life took the risk. Pray about following their footsteps The Holy Spirit is in each of us. Ask "Who do You want me to talk to? What do You want me to say? I want to help, I want to say the right words. Gonna need your help Lord!! I'm willing, but afraid of not saying things the way You want me to. I am putting my trust in you. Lead me Lord." From that moment you can relax, the Spirit will guide you. Listen and pray. It doesn't have to be a sermon or anything grandiose. It could be as simple as a smile at just the right timing, a kind word, sharing how your faith has helped you....it will be as varied as all the beautiful flowers our planet. But it will be YOU growing as a disciple and helping to grow disciples for Jesus. You've got this! Amen.
