LENTEN REGULATIONS

The Pope and the American Bishops have outlined obligatory fast and abstinence as follows:

Ash Wednesday (Wednesday March 6th) and Good Friday (April 19th) are days of abstinence for all Catholics over the age of 14. **On these two**

days, fast, as well as abstinence, is also obligatory for those from the ages of 18-59.

Abstinence means refraining from meat.

Fast means one full meal a day, with two smaller meals and nothing between meals (liquids are permitted). No Catholic will lightly excuse himself or herself from this obligation.

All Fridays in Lent are days of abstinence from meat.

Here again Catholics will not hold themselves lightly excused, but if there is a serious health problem, this obligation would not apply. We should strive to make Lent a time of prayer and penance.

Dear Parishioners,

Entering into Passiontide, the liturgical celebration of the Church comes to reach its apex leading towards Easter. This weekend, we celebrate Passion and Palm Sunday. In the ancient calendar of the Church, these were two different Sundays, remnants of which can be seen in the special entrance procession. Christ enters as the King of kings, fulfilling the ancient prophecy, which speaks of the humble way that He would enter Jerusalem. Soon, however, as the events unfold, the triumph would turn into the battle over His throne. Christ would prevail, though some followers could not recognize that His proper throne was made of the wood of the Cross, where the ancient Enemy was defeated. In the Resurrection, His victory will be clearly manifest to His followers.

On Holy Thursday, I will join my brother priests along with many of those who will be confirmed or received into the Church to celebrate the Chrism Mass with the Archbishop. As many of you know, Archbishop Carlson will have to submit his letter of resignation this coming June on his 75th birthday. While it is up to the pope to accept his resignation before he is able to step down, it is an opportunity to pray that the Lord may send us a good shepherd, who will have the strength and charity to do what is needed that the faith may not only be sustained in our Archdiocese, but grow.

Later on Thursday, please join us for the Mass of the Lord's Supper, when we will commemorate the institution of the Holy Eucharist and the ministerial priesthood, when our Lord would give us a lasting gift of His Presence among us; a way that He fulfills His promise to be with us even to the end of the world. It is through these gifts that He nourishes and guides us along the path of the Gospel. This will be an opportunity to pray for our seminarians, especially those of our parish family, Mark Madden and Jack Ruzicka, that the Lord may continue to bless them and assist them in following the Lord.

On Good Friday, there are a myriad of traditions within the Church, some rites will not only commemorate the Lord's Death, but also His burial. I

had one opportunity to celebrate this with our Maronite brothers and sisters, where a model tomb was made that was large enough to place the image of Christ from a crucifix into it. A length of prayers that united mourning along with anticipated joy are said, let alone asking forgiveness for our sins. It is a moment, when we can return spiritually back to Calvary and witness the greatest act of Love before us.

Holy Saturday will break through the darkness of the day that proceeded it with readings from salvation history, to remind us how the Father has guided humanity along the path back towards Him and to eternal life with Him. The blessing of the Easter Candle and use of fire are signs to us of His Light that we carry in this journey of life, a Light that is to lead us to Him, a Light that we are called to spread to others, that they also may know the joy of His grace and truth.

As we enter into Passiontide, may the liturgies of the Church raise up our hearts and minds to the Love that God has for us and the glory He wishes to share with us.

SPEAK UP ABOUT YOUR HEALTHCARE

This Tuesday, April 16th, is National Healthcare Decisions Day. Important decisions that need to be made in advance.

Imagine you're in a hospital and you can't speak. Soon you won't be able to swallow or breathe. Who will speak for you? Imagine your mother has slipped into a coma. She isn't expected to recover. Who will make decisions for her? Do you know her wishes? We all hope to communicate until the very end. It doesn't always happen that way. It's time to speak up! Without a plan, your health care team won't know your wishes. Your family may not know what to do. Advance care planning is about conversations and decisions. It's how we care for each other. What is an advance directive?

All adults can benefit from thinking about what their healthcare choices would be if they are unable to speak for themselves. These decisions can be written down in an advance directive so that others know what they are. Advance directives come in two main forms:

A **"healthcare power of attorney"** documents the person you select to be your voice for your healthcare decisions if you cannot speak for yourself.

A **"living will"** documents what kinds of medical treatments you would or would not want at the end of life.

With healthcare, "your decisions matter," however, others need to know your wishes to honor them. There are no wrong answers when thinking about healthcare choices and completing an advance directive. Please use April 16th, the Annual National Healthcare Decisions Day, to decide, discuss, and document your wishes, whatever they may be.

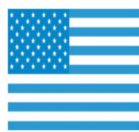
