

I thought you should know - May 30, 2021

On this glorious feast of the Holy Trinity, Fr. Jack Ruzicka celebrates his first Mass, right here at Immaculate Heart of Mary Parish. Being a priest is a wonderful life, and Sunday is the best day to be a priest. Then how wonderful is your first Sunday as a priest? Fr. Ruzicka, may the joy and glory and service and offering of this day shine forever in your heart. *Ad multos annos!*

We'll be livestreaming Fr. Ruzicka's first mass at 2:00 pm—so even if you have gone to another Mass, please join in the joy of this day! Another special event this weekend is that I will have a time for question and answers after the 4:30 pm, 7:30 am and 10:00 am Masses. I love good questions, and you'll be able to ask them anonymously if you like, so I hope you'll bring yours.

We have made progress towards hiring someone for our new Worship Leader position. I am so grateful to the team that has been helping me to interview and evaluate the candidates so far: Carolyn Moll, Elizabeth Brennan, Joe Solari, Debbie Gartner and Deacon Jim. We all owe them a debt of gratitude for the large amount of time they have given to this project, and I owe them a special debt of gratitude for the wisdom they have imparted to me. Now we are down to two candidates, and it is your turn to help!

Please come to our Worship Leader Auditions on this Tuesday, June 21, 2021 from 7 pm to 8:30 pm in church. We want your input on which candidate will best help us attract disciples and grow disciples for Jesus! Adam Bitter of Incarnate Word Parish, one of the best worship leaders in St. Louis, will also be joining us for the auditions to help me evaluate the candidate's technical abilities. Most of all, please pray that the Holy Spirit guides us in hiring the right candidate.

As we continue preparing for our parish feast day on June 12 and June 13—invite your friends and family!—we'll have confessions for 30 minutes before and after all the Masses next weekend. A visiting priest will join me in hearing confessions at those times, so you don't have to go to me if you don't want to. \square A good confession is a great way to prepare yourself for the spiritual gifts pouring out on us by our Immaculate Mother's intercession on our feast day!

Below is the next installment of our "Dedicated" Homily Series. God bless you!

We call Mother Teresa "Saint Teresa of Calcutta" now. In the back of our church there's a statue of her holding a child. Maybe you've heard the story how she and her sisters went out into the slums and found in the street a man dying, infested by worms. They took him back to their home and made him comfortable; that was the only way they could care for him, he was so far gone. Mother Teresa herself helped clean off the worms from his body. As he was dying, he said, "All my life I have lived like an animal in the streets, but I am going to die like an angel, loved and cared for." Let think about a word he used, "angel". The angels are spiritual creatures made by God and love by God. They live with God and come to earth as messengers for God's good purposes. At the end of his life, that man knew, despite so many experiences pushing the other way, that he was made by God and loved by God, that he would live with God. He believed that God had a good purpose for his life, and that at the end of his life, he was a messenger from God. He believed it because he saw it, in the eyes of Mother Teresa and her sisters. He believed it, because he saw it. Where have you seen it?

A woman wrote about living in her grandparent's home when she was about 7 years old, while her mom and dad were separated: "it looked like we were a broken family. ... The world around us seemed to say that my parents should stop trying to save what seemed un-saveable. ... Yet that was the moment when God intervened. I suddenly saw a man and a woman surrender to God, recognizing that what they had to offer to one another (and ultimately to us [children]) was very limited and often wasn't what was needed. I saw them stripping themselves of any ideals they once and accepting that they needed something else, some real help that came from outside of them." The woman goes on to tell how her parents sought out help from wise people and their faith. Then she wrote, "When I am tempted to doubt my faith, the actions of God in my past are always before more and the

memories are still vivid. I witnessed a miracle!" She believe in the power of God because she saw it. Where have you seen it?

About a decade shy of 2000 years ago, on the day of Pentecost, the Holy Spirit came down on Jesus' disciples and they went out to proclaim the good news. That day, Peter said to the crowds, "Repent and be baptized, every one of you, in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins; and you will receive the gift of the holy Spirit" (Acts 2:38). About three thousand people were baptized that day. Why did they believe it, this preaching about Jesus' promised gift of the Holy Spirit? They believed because they could see it, the Holy Spirit's "love, joy, peace, patience, kindness" in the preaching and miracles in the *lives of Peter and the disciples. Where have you seen it?*

Maybe as you listen you're thinking, "Fr. Aaron, I'm not sure that I have seen it." That could be a completely legitimate response. Maybe you don't have someone alive and kicking with the Holy Spirit, up close where you can see it. Maybe you haven't seen recently God's love for you in the eyes and care of someone near you. If that's where you are at, your struggle makes sense to me, and I can see your problem, because I was helped to faith by lives of people I know who lived their faith. But may I suggest a possible way to get around that problem? You could read a book or watch a movie about a saint. A well-told story can let us live close to someone far way. You could watch the classic movie, "A Man For All Seasons" and spend some time living close to a real person named Thomas More, who was a lawyer and a politician and who became a saint. Or, you could read a book like two that I keep thinking about: a biography of St. Therese of Liseux named "The Hidden Face" and a historical novel by Missouri's own Mark Twain entitled "Joan of Arc".

Friends, if you do have faith, listen to me for a moment. In this series of homilies, I'm asking you to consider consecrating your home to the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Immaculate Heart of Mary. I want you to dedicate your life to Jesus, so that people who live near you don't have to read a book to meet someone alive with the Holy Spirit. Last week, we learned that the Lord loves our freedom, and waits for us to invite him in. When you consecrate your home to the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Immaculate Heart of Mary, you says to the Lord, send me the Holy Spirit. "Let my life be the proof, the proof of your love" ("The Proof of Your Love"; For King and Country). You say to the world, "This family, my family, and this home, my home, is for Jesus."

You can get close to that moment of dedication little by little, because our good God often draws us closer to him little by little. But I don't think that being dedicated to God is something you can slide into. There has to be a moment when you choose it. There can be moments where you choose it more deeply, and again. At our parish feast day celebration on June 12 and June 13 you'll be able to say, if you want to, a prayer dedicating your family to the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Immaculate Heart of Mary. I hope you'll chose to pray that prayer.

If you do, it matters that you live it, for its when we live our consecration to Jesus and Mary that the light of our love and faith and hope gives witness to others by the Holy Spirit's work in us. This really can happen. Jesus said, "The Spirit of truth that proceeds from the Father, he will testify to me, and you also testify" (John 15:26-27). In the week ahead, we'll learn more about what it means to live out our consecration to Jesus and Mary, and as part of that learning, next weekend I'll take time after mass on Sunday and Saturday to answer any questions people have, whether about concertation to Jesus and Mary, or anything else. We'll have it set up so you can ask questions anonymously, and I love good questions, so if you have something you've always wanted to ask a priest, I hope you'll bring that question next week. That will take place right here in Church, after our 4:30 mass on Saturday and our 7:30 and 10 am Masses on Sunday.

For this week, I want to invite you to take some quiet time this week, and in that quiet time, to think about the scale of God's love for you, and the beauty of God's love for the people around you, and what's it like when people see it. Because if you dedicate your life to God, and you out that dedication, people will see it.

SMALL GROUP BLESSING

Years ago, I heard a quote that has rung true since the first day I became a part of the Immaculate Heart of Mary staff. "If you love what you do, you will never work a day in your life." Being on staff of Immaculate Heart of Mary is not a career. It is who I am, what I do and what I love. The Presence of the Holy Trinity has blessed my life through prayer, our parishioners, experiences and opportunities. I am forever grateful to our parish's role in helping me to grow as a disciple, increased understanding and faith as well as the desire to be a lifelong seeker of avenues to deepen my relationship with the Holy Trinity and my Catholic faith.

One of my blessings have come to me through belonging to small groups where we offer each other support and inspiration. We have discussions, grow and share our faith. The sharing of faith has been a gift beyond compare. Our IHM Renew group is one of my favorite blessings. We come together in faith, trust and support. This small group helps me grow.

One of our very dear parishioners shared a practice that she has celebrated in her home for sixty years. Her faith, story and devotion to the Blessed Mother Mary inspires me.

I especially enjoy sharing my devotion with my children and now my grandchildren. Mother Mary has been very special to me and has been there for me in difficult times. My altar is one way I let her know that she is important in my life."

I am grateful for belonging to a small group, it gifted me with Dolores sharing her story! Over sixty years of devotion to our Mother Mary! Dolores has been able to rely on Mary during good times and difficult times. I admire how she has shared her love for the Blessed Mother with family, friends and now our parish family.

We are just a few weeks away from our Parish Feast Day of the Immaculate Heart of Mary, June 12 and 13, I am going to grow from Dolores faith sharing. I will have a Mary Altar in my home and begin spending more time on my relationship with the Blessed Mother. Thank you Dolores!
