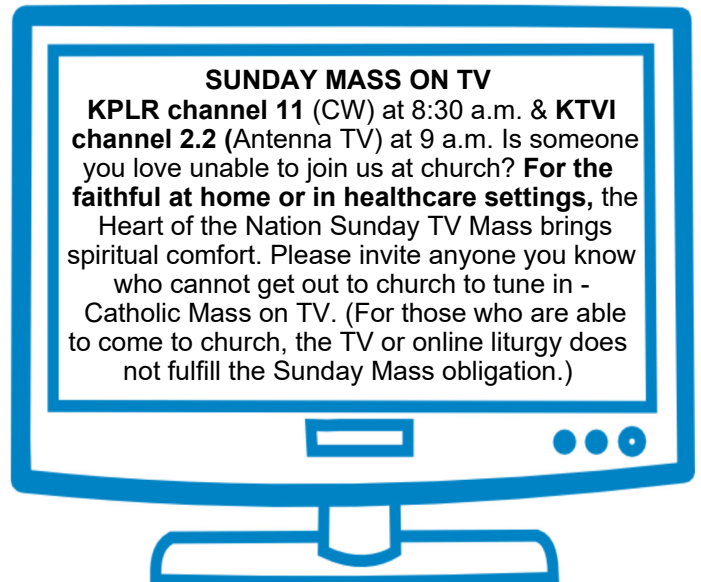

Dear Parishioners,

In today's holy Gospel, our Lord commands us to love one another as He has loved us, and that this witness will show us as His true followers. This is a well-known line from the Gospels, and one that receives little resistance, as most would agree that we should follow the Lord. The difficulty, of course, is how this is actually practiced in our daily lives. To love another as Christ has loved, means that we are willing to die for the good of another for their salvation to the glory of God.

After Judas betrays our Lord, Jesus states that God is now glorified in the Son of Man. How does betrayal glorify God? It is not so much the betrayal, as much as the fidelity of Jesus to the Father's plan that He is glorified. He will face betrayal and even death for us. That is His glory. He remains true to the Gospel, even when one close to Him turns Him in to those who desire His death.

Do we love one another this much? While many would put themselves in harm's way to save the earthly life of a loved one, how many would go to that extent to save that person's eternal life? A common temptation in our contemporary mind is that of presumption, where we take our salvation for granted, as if it is signed and sealed in the mercy of God regardless of how we live our lives. While we leave to Him the judgment of any soul, as He only can read our hearts, the question as to what extent we would go to save another still remains before us. Are we willing to challenge another? Or are we caught up in the mindset that making anyone feel uncomfortable about their choices is an evil in itself?

The fullness of the Gospel does not offer a "safe space" that avoids offending anyone, but as we see, it challenges the human heart to consider who it is before God and the truth. While it offers a path to eternal peace, it does not do this without the reality of the Cross. There is suffering in conversion, as we recognize that we are weak and fallen and in need of repentance. The question is whether we are willing to "go there" to help one another live in

the light of Christ. Our Lord embraced fully our fallen condition with an authentic love without fear of death, and He openly challenges sin and error so that we may be justified by God and lead us to salvation. May He grant us the faith to love as He loved that God may be glorified in us.

Just give it one try, or in some cases, one more try, and see if you don't feel the calling. Don't let lack of transportation or other obstacles stand in your way.

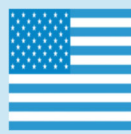
