I though you should know-December 6, 2020

Your parish staff—Debbie, Kevin, Deacon Jim and Fr. Aaron—believe that our Lord wants Immaculate Heart of Mary Parish to be **a growing parish of disciples who are growing**. So we have set a goal. By August 15, 2021, we want to dramatically improve Sunday at Immaculate Heart of Mary Parish. Prayer and discussion led us to say that dramatically improving Sunday Mass is the best way we can help people who don't know Jesus meet Jesus and the best way we can help all of us grow as disciples.

We see 6 objectives that we need to accomplish to make Sunday worship dramatically better.

1. Learn How: learn from growing churches how to worship well here on Sunday
2. Communicate Vision: share our goal and why it's worth it with parishioners and parish leaders
3. Warm Welcome: consistently greet and honor on Sunday people not already deep in parish life
4. Moving Music: sing and play music that moves hearts in prayer to faith, hope, and love
5. Relevant Message: preach how in daily life God asks for change and encourages what's good
6. Faith Family: connect disciples here on Sunday they so know each other and support each other

Here are some of the first steps we are taking on our objectives. We are learning how to do Sunday better by reading *Rebuilt: the story of a Catholic Parish and working on learning how to livestream a Mass*. We are adding music to our 4:30 Vigil Mass and we are discerning a vision and values for music at our parish. We are preaching in homily series. We are using special occasions to practice hospitality.

We still have so much to learn and so much to do! So we ask your help. Please pray for our parish. Tell us your ideas on how to reach our goal. Pray and think about what your gifts are and one thing you could do to help with our goal; then give us a call. If you have questions, talk with anyone on staff: we're excited about this goal! God bless you!

Here's the first homily from our new homily series, "Peace on Earth". May God bless your Advent!

What if we used what's different this year to go deeper in what's always the same? For me, Thanksgiving was not normal this year. Some parts were great, like hooting and hollering in the front yard of our relatives when we dropped off food for them, and some parts were not great, like substituting a Zoom call for your usual fun and games. But it was definitely not normal. If we are realistic, Christmas and this season before Christmas, Advent, is probably going to be different, too. Yet St. Paul reminded us of good news. Amid so many things that are subject to change and that are not reliable, there are things we really can count on: God is faithful. Indeed, St. Paul told us something more. He said, "You are not lacking in any spiritual gift as you wait for the revelation of our Lord Jesus Christ."

That's why I propose we make from our 2020 lemons sweet lemonade. I think this Christmas has the potential to be something really special. Isn't God clearing a lot of activities from our calendars? Isn't God quieting some of the activity that most years fills this Advent season before Christmas with noise? And we know God wants to give us peace. "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth, *peace to people of good will*": *that's what the angels sang to announce Jesus' birth*. At each Mass, Jesus says to us, "Peace I leave with you, my peace I give to you." And he said, "Not as the world gives do I give it to you." *The world's peace comes from having everything "just right". Christ's peace is offered in good times and in bad, and sickness and in health. Very often, it is offered in our personal prayer. So that's why I propose we use this Advent to learn to pray well.*

Learn to pray well, and this Christmas could be one when you taste God's peace, one of your best Christmases ever. Learn to pray well, and you carry away from this Christmas a permanent gift, something to make every future Christmas season better. I am excited about the possibility of using the Advent for praying well, and so I'm going to make two commitments to you. First, at every Sunday of Advent, I'll set aside some of my homily time for guided, personal, quiet prayer, so you can practice praying well, so you can have at least one time each week when you are seeking God's peace. Second, for every Sunday of Advent, I'm going to give you coaching on how to pray well.

I'd also like to ask two commitments of you. First, I invite you to commit to this series of message. I'm calling it "Peace on Earth". Come back each weekend till Christmas to practice praying well. If you miss a week, catch up by reading the

message in the next week's bulletin. Second, I invite you to commit this Advent to daily personal prayer; time each day between now and Christmas for personal quiet prayer. That's what I'm asking: commit to this series, and commit to daily personal prayer.

So let me keep my commitment to you. Let's pray, and then I'll give you three quick tips for this first week. If you don't mind, would you please sit back for moment, close your eyes, and follow this next part in your own hearts?

Let us remember that we are in the holy presence of God.—Let's look back on the last day, the last twenty-four hours, and whatever was good, let's give God thanks for that now in our hearts.—Let's look back on the last day, the last twenty-four hours, and whatever was bad, wherever we sinned or missed the mark, let's ask God to forgive now in our heart.—Let's look to the days ahead, to the weeks ahead, and whatever we'd like God to bless, whoever we'd like him to help, let's ask him now in our own hearts to please help.—Finally, if you can, in the quiet of your own hearts, I invite you to say to God, "I love you."

Alright, you can open your eyes, if you want. Thank you for taking time for prayer. Here's three quick tips for the week ahead.

First: pray as you can, not as you can't. That prayer we just did works for a lot of people. If it works for you, use it; pray you can. But if that prayer doesn't work for you, then don't try to pray as you can't. Find some other way to pray that works better for you. Personal prayer is personal, so please don't beat yourself up spending your personal prayer time in a style of prayer that just does not work for you. Pray as you can, not as you can't.

Second: Be steady. Even in this first week, you might have a super amazing experience in prayer. If that happens, be steady. Thank Jesus for his gift, and remember that you'll want to be faithful to him later on when prayer is harder. On the other hand, even in this first week, you might have days where it is really hard to pray. If that happens, be steady. Remember God really loves what you are trying to do, and he's doing some good work down in your soul where you just can't see yet.

Third: keep your commitment. The hardest day to pray this advent, the most important day to pray this Advent is likely to be the day *after you forget to pray*. *So if you put off prayer one day so late that you are falling asleep, stand or walk or sit in a hard chair or do what you have to, but keep your commitment. If you start that prayer time and you fall asleep, be at peace; you kept your commitment. Or if you wake up to pray and it's so early you can't put two thoughts together, well, drink some coffee or pound a Jolt or kneel by your bed collapsed half-collapsed on top of it, or do what you have to, but keep your commitment. God will honor it, even if you don't have your pretty face on. And if you don't to pray one day by accident or by weakness, the day after that, keep your commitment: because on that day, Jesus loves you and offers you mercy, and a new start.*

So, Pray as you can, not as you can't. Be steady. Keep your commitment. "Grace to you," this week, brothers and sister, "and peace, from God our Father, and the Lord Jesus Christ."

Jesus, Can you hear me?

Have you ever felt like you were in the desert? All alone? We can be in house full of people and feel isolated and alone or we can be living individually. Either way the feeling can be frightening.

It will soon be a year since I experienced the stroke/aneurysm. I remember being alone in the ICU, just me and the monitors. I do not remember being afraid, but I do remember feeling alone. I can usually talk with Jesus and pour my heart out. That was not the case, I couldn't find the words. All I could utter, was three words; "Help me Jesus." I would say these three words over and over. Silently and out loud, until peace came over me. There is tremendous peace in knowing whether I am having a lengthy conversation or uttering three words, My Lord hears me and knows my heart. He is within me and I am not alone.

During this Advent season, may we bless ourselves with taking time to talk with Jesus about what is on our hearts. Tell him what is going well, what are things you wish you had done differently, ask his forgiveness where needed and let him know where you need help or what concerns you. Find peace in knowing Jesus hears you and you are not alone.

PREPARE THE WAY OF THE LORD?

On this second Sunday of Advent, we are called to reflect on the actions of John the Baptist, who prepared the way for Jesus. John was definite in his message that the Messiah was coming. The message he delivered to the people remains relevant for us today. "Prepare the way of the Lord and make or paths straight."

An important message for us to reflect on during this advent season. There may be things in our lives that need to be straightened or changes that need to be made. Advent can be the perfect opportunity to increase our prayer time and consider celebrating the Sacrament of Reconciliation, one of the gifts of our Church.

Saint Juan Diego Saint of the Day for December 9

Saint Juan Diego's Story

Thousands of people gathered in the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe July 31, 2002, for the canonization of Juan Diego, to whom the Blessed Mother appeared in the 16th century. Pope John Paul II celebrated the ceremony at which the poor Indian peasant became the Church's first saint indigenous to the Americas.

The Holy Father called the new saint "a simple, humble Indian" who accepted Christianity without giving up his identity as an Indian. "In praising the Indian Juan Diego, I want to express to all of you the closeness of the Church and the pope, embracing you with love and encouraging you to overcome with hope the difficult times you are going through," John Paul said. Among the thousands present for the event were members of Mexico's 64 indigenous groups.


First called *Cuauhtlatohuac* ("The eagle who speaks"), Juan Diego's name is forever linked with Our Lady of Guadalupe because it was to him that she first appeared at Tepeyac hill on December 9, 1531. The most famous part of his story is told in connection with the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe on December 12. After the roses gathered in his tilma were transformed into the miraculous image of Our Lady, however, little more is said about Juan Diego.

In time he lived near the shrine constructed at Tepeyac, revered as a holy, unselfish, and compassionate catechist, who taught by word and especially by example.

During his 1990 pastoral visit to Mexico, Pope John Paul II confirmed the long-standing liturgical cult in honor of Juan Diego, beatifying him. Twelve years later the same pope proclaimed him a saint.

Reflection

God counted on Juan Diego to play a humble, yet huge role in bringing the Good News to the peoples of Mexico. Overcoming his own fear and the doubts of Bishop Juan de Zumarraga, Juan Diego cooperated with God's grace in showing his people that the Good News of Jesus is for everyone. Pope John Paul II used the occasion of Juan Diego's beatification to urge Mexican lay people to assume their responsibilities for passing on the Good News and witnessing to it.
