Saint of the Week



Saint Gregory the Great
Saint of the Day for September 3rd

Saint Gregory the Great's Story

Gregory was the prefect of Rome before he was 30. After five years in office he resigned, founded six monasteries on his Sicilian estate, and became a Benedictine monk in his own home at Rome.

Ordained a priest, Gregory became one of the pope's seven deacons, and also served six years in the East as papal representative in Constantinople. He was recalled to become abbot, but at the age of 50 was elected pope by the clergy and people of Rome.

Gregory was direct and firm. He removed unworthy priests from office, forbade taking money for many services, emptied the papal treasury to ransom prisoners of the Lombards and to care for persecuted Jews and the victims of plague and famine. He was very concerned about the conversion of England, sending 40 monks from his own monastery. He is known for his reform of the liturgy, and for strengthening respect for doctrine. Whether he was largely responsible for the revision of "Gregorian" chant is disputed.

Gregory lived in a time of perpetual strife with invading Lombards and difficult relations with the East. When Rome itself was under attack, he interviewed the Lombard king.

His book, *Pastoral Care*, on the duties and qualities of a bishop, was read for centuries after his death. He described bishops mainly as physicians whose main duties were preaching

and the enforcement of discipline. In his own down-to-earth preaching, Gregory was skilled at applying the daily Gospel to the needs of his listeners. Called "the Great," Gregory has been given a place with Augustine, Ambrose, and Jerome, as one of the four key doctors of the Western Church.

An Anglican historian has written: "It is impossible to conceive what would have been the confusion, the lawlessness, the chaotic state of the Middle Ages without the medieval papacy; and of the medieval papacy, the real father is Gregory the Great."

Reflection

Gregory was content to be a monk, but he willingly served the Church in other ways when asked. He sacrificed his own preferences in many ways, especially when he was called to be Bishop of Rome. Once he was called to public service, Gregory gave his considerable energies completely to this work. Gregory's description of bishops as physicians fits in well with Pope Francis' description of the Church as a "field hospital."

RCIA COMING SOON

What is The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)? It is a program where interested adults are introduced to the Catholic faith in a planned and gradual process. It is the beginning step of a journey of faith with our Lord and his Church. Persons interested in learning more about the Catholic Church usually begin by contacting the Rectory and speaking to Father Teater or Deacon Jim. Anyone, even practicing Catholics, are welcome to attend and are encouraged to participate in the RCIA meetings which generally meet on Sundays, after the 10:00 a.m. Mass in the Rectory Meeting Room. Classes will begin late September.

Who Comes to RCIA and Why?

For an adult who has never been baptized, the RCIA program gradually explores the story of God's salvation for all, the mystery of Jesus' life death and resurrection, and the ongoing presence of the Holy Spirit as revealed in our beliefs, sacramental life and spiritual practices of the Catholic Church. This journey of formation includes various stages and events as well as rituals which mark the transition from and to each stage. For Baptized Christians who would like full communion with the Catholic Church, the RCIA program includes education, rites and instructions into Catholic practice and culture. For Baptized Catholics that have received no other faith formation and have never received the sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist, the RCIA program includes education and pastoral practices to become a fully initiated Catholic. If you are a Catholic fully initiated in the Catholic Church and wish to share your faith journey or would like to polish up on your skills and knowledge of the Catholic Church, then please join us.

What Can You Do to Help?

Pray to the Holy Spirit for all those individuals who are participating in or thinking about joining in RCIA. Welcome new persons you meet a church and introduce yourself and invite them to "come and see" any of the parish ministries or organizations you belong to. Consider volunteering to be available as a sponsor for a person in RCIA, if asked. Invite a friend or acquaintance that you know who might wish to explore the faith and possibly join the Catholic Church. You might never know if you don't ask them! Be an example in your own life by being a faithful Catholic.
