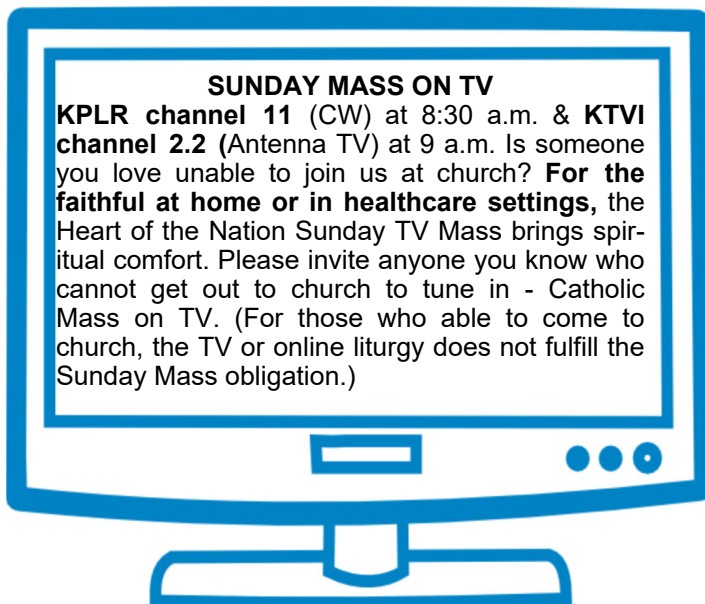

Dear Parishioners,

This weekend, we celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday as we close the octave of Easter. In the liturgical tradition of the Church, special solemnities are not only celebrated on one day, but for a total of eight days. We can look at the liturgies of the Old Testament and see similarities, where certain feasts go on for much longer than one day. The number eight has a certain symbolism for Christians. In Genesis, we hear of God creating the world in "seven days," but we also learn how early humanity sinned against God along with its tragic effects. God, in His divine Mercy, chooses to redeem the world through the mission of Jesus Christ, and with the Resurrection, God re-creates the fallen world with an "eighth day." The connection between the Resurrection and the number eight was made quite early in the Church's history, as ancient baptismal fonts and those oratories that were used to celebrate the sacrament of Baptism have eight sides. In a way, these physical symbols express how through this sacrament, we are immersed in this "eighth day" of new life and grace. As we celebrate this new life on Divine Mercy Sunday, we pray that our Lord may truly make His Presence known to us by the conversion of our lives through the gift of His Mercy.

As the seminary calendar comes to a close, we are in the midst of gearing up for graduation as well as ordinations. Next weekend, two St. Louis men will be ordained to the transitional diaconate...and as mentioned last week, seven St. Louisans, including our Mark Madden, will be ordained to the priesthood on May 25th. Please keep Mark and his classmates in your prayers as they begin public ministry as priests.

Please keep the seminary in your prayers as well, given that next year we are looking at numbers that may very well necessitate some of the guys "bunking" in the same room. This is definitely a good sign in our ministry and program of formation at Kenrick-Glennon Seminary. At present, we have men coming from Colorado to Tennessee and from

North Dakota to Texas. While this will demand more time and resources, it is good to see that many dioceses trust St. Louis to form their seminarians properly and faithfully.

Thanks to all those who assisted in the liturgies of Holy Week and Easter and decorating the church! May the Risen Lord continue to bless our parish and families during this Easter season!

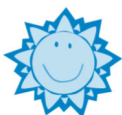
