## I thought you should know - June 13, 2021

Happy feast of the Immaculate Heart of Mary! May you feel the love and motherly care of Mary the Mother of Jesus and our Mother, too, who loves us so. If you are a guest or if you are here for the first time, we are so glad that you are joining us on this joyful day when we remember the woman in heaven, beautiful inside and out, from whom our parish takes its name.

What a blessing it has been to be a priest here at Immaculate Heart of Mary for the past ten months! Our parish has a wonderful history and so many good people have given us the gifts that make this community what it is. By God's grace, we also can have a wonderful future, if we listen to Jesus and do what he cares about, growing as his disciples and helping people come to faith in him, receive his hope, and live by his love. "By this is my Father glorified," Jesus says, "that you bear much fruit and become my disciples" (John 15:8).

At Mass today, I hope you chose to join us in dedicating your life to Jesus by consecrating your family to the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Immaculate Heart of Mary. If you made that big step, congratulations! I encourage you to keep moving forward in your consecration by renewing it daily, by taking CARE of it-see my homily from last week below J-and enthroning an image of Jesus and Mary in your home. Use the last page of the bulletin to sign up for a home enthronement! You can turn that form into the rectory office or just drop it in the collection basket.

The holy card we gave out today is yours to keep. Since today's a joyful day, we have treats available in the back after Mass; please join in the free fun. Meet and be friendly with someone you don't already know, ok? God bless you!

What a gift to see Fr. Jack Ruzicka, who grew up in our church, ordained a priest last Saturday and to celebrate with him his first mass here last Sunday. He reminded me how blessed I am to be a priest. One of the blessings is visiting people who are very sick. What a privilege to help people, sometimes when even the best doctors can't. It's also a privilege because I get to meet the friends and relatives caring for them. Their love is inspiring! They give humble, hidden, and hard work because they care. What most people they know-coworkers, neighbors-don't get to see, I get to see, and how much the sick person appreciates their love, and how dear their care is to God. Their love and dedication shines by the way they care.

Today we celebrate Jesus' care for us, a unique sign of his care for us. This unique sign is not just beautiful words in a story, or a consoling idea, but an event that happened in history and a miracle that continues today. For today is the great feast of Corpus Christi, Latin words meaning "the Body of Christ". Today we remember that Jesus gave us his Body and Blood, really, truly, under the signs of bread and wine. At each Catholic Eucharist, at each Mass, after the prayer of consecration prayer the bread really becomes the Body of Christ, Jesus himself, though hidden from sight. After the consecration prayer, the wine really becomes the Blood of Christ, Jesus himself, though unchanged in taste. The Eucharist began at the Last Supper the night before Jesus died, and each time the Eucharist occurs again, Jesus says to you and me, "This is my body; this is my blood; I am giving you my heart; may I please have yours?"

Respecting our freedom, Jesus lets us choose how we respond. One beautiful way to say, "Jesus, also my heart is yours", is consecrating your family to the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Immaculate Heart of Mary. It's a powerful way to dedicate your life to God. Next week, here at Mass, you will have a chance to choose it.

In past weeks, we've been learning how important it is that we live out our consecration after we make it,
if we make it. When we live it, that's when the power of the Holy Spirit comes through our lives to help others; when we live it, that is when the love of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit starts shining from our homes. And last week, we introduced four humble ways to keep our consecration shining and strong, four ways to care for our consecration by prayer. CARE: C-Confession, A-Adoration, R-Rosary, and E-Eucharist. Let's take a quick glance at how each shows Jesus that we care.
C stands for Confession. What are the three most powerful words for taking care of your love and making it last? Maybe not, "I love you", but instead, "Please forgive me" or "I forgive you." Each good confession we make to a priest says to Jesus specifically, sincerely, the way he asked us to say it, "Please forgive me". And in each good confession, Jesus speaks to us through the priest, saying, "I forgive you." What's more, if we have the misfortune to commit serious sin-I mean, if we do on purpose something we knew was wrong, and it was something serious-we need to go to confession as soon as possible and before we receive communion. For no matter how great our sin, a good confession opens the gates of heaven to us, restores the life of God to our souls, and renews our consecration to the Sacred and Immaculate Hearts. Incidentally, I'll be hearing confessions for thirty minutes before and after all masses this weekend [of June 5 and June 6]; if those times work for you, you find me right over there.

A stands for Adoration. Adoration means visiting the Body of Christ, Jesus is truly present in the Eucharist, in a church or chapel. In adoration, Jesus welcomes us as a loving friend, sitting with us and passing time with us, always ready to give us rest or hear our concerns or talk with us about our joys. We get to be with the Heart of the Kingdom of God, and meet with the Second Person of the Blessed Trinity, who became our brother and friend.
R stands for Rosary. [Show rosary beads.] Maybe you've seen these hanging from a rearview mirror in a Catholic's car, or held in the hands of the deceased at a Catholic wake. Rosary beads are a tool to guide us through a pattern of prayer. When we pray the rosary, we spend time with Mary thinking about Jesus’ love. While we think with her, we use the rosary beads to help us keep up a pattern of prayers, making each little prayer a gift to Jesus and Mary's hearts, and giving us something to refocus us if we get distracted. Since the Rosary is a prayer, you can say it while driving or going through your day, it's a great way to spend time with Jesus and Mary and care for your consecration.
E stands for Eucharist. The word "Eucharist" in Greek means thanksgiving. It's what we do here at Mass, and it's the greatest prayer of the Church, because in the Eucharist, we enter into Jesus' own thanksgiving sacrifice. He unites us to what he did on Calvary, offering himself with love to the Father, thanking the Father for his goodness, and looking forward to the joy of heaven with us. Muscles get stronger when you exercise, and the exercise of joining Jesus in offering love and in thanking the Father is the best way of all to exercise our spiritual heart muscles.
If you consecrate your family to Jesus and Mary at our parish feast day next week, remember that CARE, Confession, Adoration, Rosary and Eucharist, C-A-R-E is a great way to take care of your consecration by prayer and make it shine. I'm looking forward to next week, and I hope you are, too. But do you know what? Our relationship with Jesus is never centered in next week or next month or next year, in who we used to be or who we might be someday. Rather, right now, he loves you, and right now he welcomes you, and right now you can give him joy. For right now, in each moment, and in a special way in this Eucharist, he says to you, "Here is my heart; may I please have yours?" So, I invite you, whatever you might choose next week, to say to Jesus today, "My heart also is yours."

## Saint Romuald

Saint of the Day for June 19

## Saint Romuald's Story

In the midst of a wasted youth, Romuald watched his father kill a relative in a duel over property. In horror he fled to a monastery near Ravenna. After three years, some of the monks found him to be uncomfortably holy and eased him out.

Romuald spent the next 30 years going about Italy, founding monasteries and hermitages. He longed to give his life to Christ in martyrdom, and got the pope's permission to preach the gospel in Hungary. But he was struck with illness as soon as he arrived, and the illness recurred as often as he tried to proceed.

During another period of his life, Romuald suffered great spiritual dryness. One day as he was praying Psalm 31 ("I will give you understanding and I will instruct you"), he was given an extraordinary light and spirit which never left him.
At the next monastery where he stayed, Romuald was accused of a scandalous crime by a young nobleman he had rebuked for a dissolute life. Amazingly, his fellow monks believed the accusation. He was given a severe penance, forbidden from offering Mass, and excommunicated-an unjust sentence that he endured in silence for six months.

The most famous of the monasteries Romuald founded was that of the Camaldoli in Tuscany. Here began the Order of the Camaldolese Benedictines, uniting the monastic and eremitical lives. In later life Romuald's own father became a monk, wavered, and was kept faithful by the encouragement of his son.

## Reflection

Christ is a gentle leader, but he calls us to total holiness. Now and then, men and women are raised up to challenge us by the absoluteness of their dedication, the vigor of their spirit, the depth of their conversion. The fact that we cannot duplicate their lives does not change the call to us to be totally open to God in our own particular circumstances.
