CASTING OUR NETS?

In the first reading we hear how Peter and the apostles told the Sanhedrin that "We must obey God rather than men." Then in the Gospel we hear that Jesus appeared to the disciples after

they had fished all night without any success. Jesus told them to "Cast the net over the right side of the boat and you will find something." Despite being tired, the disciples obeyed and they caught 153 large fish! We have so many reasons that we can give for not wanting to obey God and "cast our nets" by sharing the Gospel message with others through our example and our actions. Here are just a few: we are tired; we would rather stay in our comfort zone; we are afraid because we think we don't know our faith well enough; or we would rather do what we want. This week we can spend some time pondering these questions: Do I obey God when I hear Him speaking to me in my heart? Do I cast my nets through my example and actions? Do I cave into the pressures of our current culture or to my own desires?

Dear Parishioners,

This month dedicated to our Blessed Mother in the tradition of the Church reminds us of the important role she has played and continues to play in God's plan of salvation. Like any other vocation of a parent, hers does not end but continues to this day. Having said "Let it be done to me according to Your Will" once in history, she continues to respond to her call to be the Mother of the Savior with all its effects. She is also our Mother in the order of grace, and she offers prayers on our behalf before God. May she guide us to conform our lives more to that of her Son so that His Will may be fulfilled in us!
